

2 Introduction -

2.3 Study Area and Period

The college premise was considered as the study area. A field survey was conducted to collect the field data for Rapid survey.

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3 Baseline Environmental survey -

The baseline data was collected by necessary monitoring at site, collection of established data through secondary agencies. The baseline data collection includes the following components or systems:

3.1 Observations –

In the two-day field survey, detail discussion with the college officials was done regarding demand of the life support system. Also, detail inspection of the total area was done for getting details of the energy, water, biodiversity, etc, in the study area.

Information collected from the college officials and the observations is as follows -

3.1.1 Water -

There is no surface water resource in the company premises. There is one yielding bore well in the premises which help in completing the water requirement of the office activities.

3.1.2 Electrical energy -

It is a college & It requires considerable consumption of electricity.

3.1.3 Air -

Air quality in the area is good. There is possibility of improvement in the quality by increasing planting density in the premises.

3.1.4 Soll -

Soil is usually differentiated into horizons of minerals and organic constituents of varying depth, which differ from the parent material below in morphology, physical properties and constituents, chemical properties and composition and biological characteristics.

Soil serves as a source of nutrients for plants and crops and also provides mechanical anchorage.

Soil in the area is in good condition. Most of the soil is back filled for gardening. More than 50% of the area is covered with plant cover. Conditioning of the soil is required to achieve better soil quality. This will help in enhancing the soil quality which will, in turn, will enhance the bio diversity in this area by strengthening the local ecosystem.

3.1.5 – Bio-diversity –

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A. Flora - Majority of the plant species are exotic. About 50 species of plants in the area were recorded in the visit.

B. Fauna - More than 15 species of birds, few of butterflies were recorded in the survey.

3.1.6 Nolse -

Noise can be defined as an unwanted sound. It interferes with speech and hearing. If intense enough, it can damage hearing, or is otherwise annoying. In general, there is almost no noise pollution in the premises.

3.1.7 Waste Management -

Garden waste is dumped in one corner for composting. Composting of this waste will help in improvement of the place and will reduce requirement of the fertilizers to an extent.

Waste water treatment plant was installed with help of municipal corporation. But, it is currently defunct and appropriate steps are necessary to treat the waste water.

After proper treatment, this water can be used for secondary purposes like flushing in the toilets, gardening, etc.

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4 Preliminary findings -

4.1 Water-

- Captive Source bore well
- Recharging of bore well is done & water is used for plantation
- Eco san toilets are now in use
- Recycling unit for treating wastewater has been brought into working condition

4.2 Electrical Energy

- Present average monthly charges Rs. 28,000 (Reduced from average Rs. 40,000/-)
- Less wattage results in decrease in electric bill. Good potential for reducing average electricity bill by;
 - ✓ replaced tubes (Approx. 95%) with CFLs / LEDs
 - ✓ all monitors are now low consumption LCD monitors
 - ✓ educating staff about importance of these things

4.3 Air

- In general, air quality within the premises appears good
- Possibility of enhancing the air quality by improving planting density and variety in the garden as well as building
- By good housekeeping and cleanliness on terrace & in the whole premise

4.4 Soil

- For gardening purpose, considerable volume of soil is backfilled
- Presently in good condition
- Requires attention to retain it and its fertility. Conditioning of the soil with inhouse compost and adding external nutritive, as & when required, will help in enhancing the quality of the soil.

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4.5 Biodiversity -

Existing

- About 50 species of plants
- About 15 species of birds
- Majority of the plants are exotic

Improvement possibilities

- Raising botanical garden is in progress
- Introduction of plants for butterfly garden is in progress
- Introduction of fishes in the water features

4.6 Noise -

Existing

- In general, quite silent, almost no noise pollution
- Background hum created by running of AC and pumps

Butterfly garden -

It is a very attractive concept, which helps students giving opportunity to observe different species of butterflies in a small captive area.

Butterfly gardening is often aimed at inviting those butterflies and moths to lay eggs as well. Because some plants are not fed upon by adult butterflies, the caterpillar host should also be planted for a bigger population of butterflies. Butterflies typically feed on the nectar of flowers, and there are hundreds of such plants that may be planted to attract them, depending on the location, time of year, and other factors. In addition to the planting of flowers that feed butterflies, other means of attracting them include constructing "butterfly houses", providing sand for puddling, water, and other resources or food items, including rotten fruit. This makes the place centre of attraction and it also help the biology students.

Some people only like to look at the butterflies, while others like to take pictures as well. Others try to help the butterfly population by planting native plants which rare or threatened butterflies feed on. Butterflies also serve as flower pollinators and attracting the butterflies can also assist in the pollination of nearby plants. Typically, flowers of plants that attract butterflies also attract other insect pollinators.

Puddling - Groups of male butterflies often congregate at puddles of water to drink. Mudpuddling offers them the opportunity to get the salt and amino acids they need. You can create your own puddle by digging a shallow depression in or near your garden. Line it with plastic, fill it with sand or gravel and add water.
